The Back Mountain Police Association is holding its 17th annual "BMPA Rusty Flack Memorial Kid's Fishing Day" at Frances Slocum State Park on Saturday, May 3rd, 2025. This year, approximately 200 children AGES 5 THROUGH 12 will enjoy a fun-filled day fishing for over 1000 trout (including several trophy sized) in a net-enclosed area of Frances Slocum Lake. A handicapped-accessible dock is provided for the convenience of children with special needs. Loaner fishing poles, bait, and tackle will be provided. In addition to fishing, the children receive a gift, have lunch, take part in Fishing Instruction classes, view Police K-9 demonstrations, receive fire prevention education inside our sponsored fire safety smoke house and have plenty of opportunities to interact with uniformed law enforcement officers alongside their vehicles and equipment. **All free of charge because of our generous supporters.**

Following this year's event, we are partnering with an organization to provide autistic children the opportunity to spend a peaceful evening fishing in the stocked area. Each child will receive a free rod & reel as a gift.
